Applications of UDL:

Supporting Writers with Disabilities& Neurodiverse Writers

Universal Design for Learning (UDL)

Teaching method designed to **identify** and **adapt to barriers**, "enhanc[ing] experiences for people with disabilities and for everyone else" by **anticipating multiple needs** and **providing options** for interactions of bodies, minds, and environments (Kleinfeld).

Tutoring Practices

- make options visible
 - transparency
- discuss writer needs
- negotiate tutor & writer needs
- multimodal opportunities

Physical Space

- focus on equity instead of equality
- inside vs outside
- adjustable options
